"An Act to improve protections relative to domestic violence"

By Representatives Higgins of Leominster, Nguyen of Andover, and Senator Michael Moore

PURPOSE

- Ensures recognition of coercive control and technological abuse as a part of Chapter 209A: Abuse Prevention (Restraining) Orders.
- Expands the statute of limitations in domestic violence cases from 6 years to 15 years.
- Highlights dangerous forms of abuse outside of physical or threatened violence. Thus, allowing the civil court to recognize those actions as grounds for a protective, restraining, order.

IMPACTS

By implementing coercive control and technological abuse to our laws, less visible forms of abuse are recognized, giving survivors the opportunity to seek protection. 95% domestic abuse survivors reported experiencing coercive control.

97% domestic abuse survivors reported experiencing technological abuse. (NARIKA)
